Vidya has also zealously advocated in federal court in matters involving the death penalty, the criminalization of abortion, and gender-based violence.

She received her B.A. from Wellesley College, where she served as the Shirley R. Sherr Human Rights Fellow. During law school, Vidya was a student attorney for the International Human Rights Law Clinic, where she represented clients before Circuit Courts of Appeals and assisted in drafting reports documenting worker exploitation and abuses. Vidya served at the Civil Rights Division of the US Department of Justice, where she worked primarily on litigation combating police brutality, and for the Human Rights Program of the ACLU, where she had the privilege of working on Alien Tort Statute litigation on behalf of victims of torture and illegal detention. Prior to law school, Vidya was a Program Associate for the Ford Foundation's Democracy, Rights, and Justice initiative, where she worked on grant-making initiatives to advance women's human rights and sexual and reproductive health and rights domestically and globally.
